DIRECTIONS:

From the East:

Proceed north or south on Route 287 and take the Route 1 North Exit. Proceed on Route 1 North for approximately 3 miles to the Gill Lane Exit. Follow Jug Handle to Route 1 South. The hotel is immediately on the right.

From North:

Take the Garden State Parkway to Exit 131-A. At the fourth light turn right, and pass Metropark Train Station on the left. After the third light, turn right onto Gill Lane.

The hotel is 1.5 miles further on the right.


From Newark International Airport:
